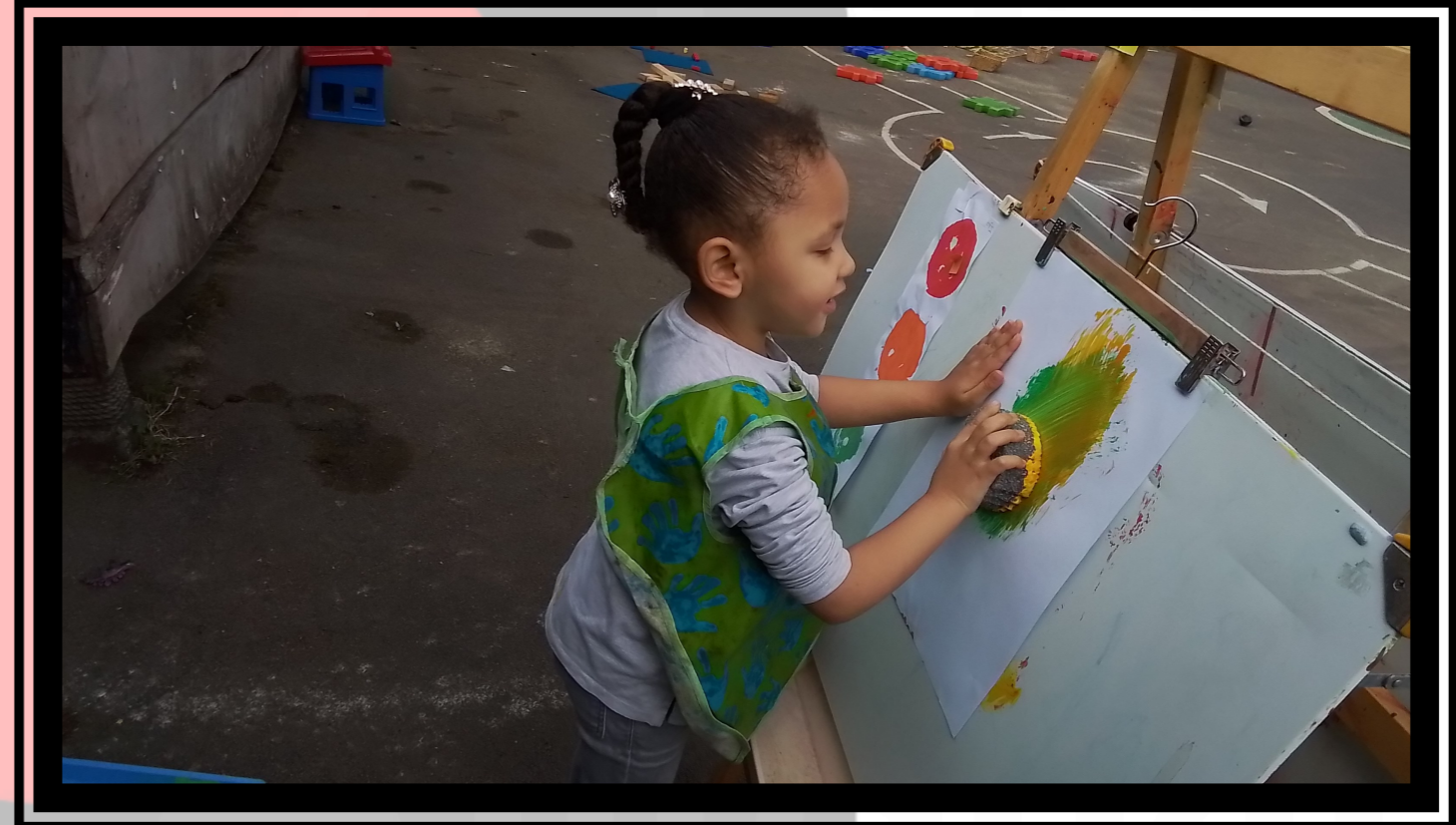


# Making Traffic Light Pictures for Black History Month
